Erasmus+ to program Unii Europejskiej w dziedzinie edukacji, szkoleń, młodzieży i sportu na lata 2014-2020. Jego całkowity budżet wynosi 14,7 mld euro. Erasmus+ opiera się na osiągnięciach europejskich programów edukacyjnych, które funkcjonowały przez 25 lat, i jest wynikiem połączenia następujących europejskich inicjatyw realizowanych przez Komisję Europejską w latach 2007-2013: programu „Uczenie się przez całe życie”, programu „Młodzież w działaniu”, Erasmus Mundus, Tempus, Alfa, Edulink, oraz programów współpracy z krajami uprzemysłowionymi w dziedzinie szkolnictwa wyższego.

Nasza szkoła w roku szkolnym 2018/2019 rozpoczęła realizację 2-letniego projektu "Know Your Rights To Defend Yourself". Naszymi partnerami są szkoły z: Hiszpanii (koordynator), Włoch i Rumunii.

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About the project

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In the recent years there is a growing manifestation for understanding the need for protection of human rights by the governments and it came along with the acceptance of the need for education regarding human rights. Human rights education is now recognized on an international level as an important component of all level education. However, not all European education gave importance to this topic area, so sometimes schools must take the initiative in making their materials and including Human Rights education elements in curricular and extracurricular activities. By participating in this project, all partners want to exchange experience and also analyze the state of things regarding HR education in different European countries. After that, we wish to share our findings with our peers across all Europe. We also wish to make a course for pupils between 5 to 14-year-olds, mixed-ability groups / special education needs students that each partner can implement later on with generations to come.

The course will be 8-10 weeks long, while the student will be taught general concepts of human rights and also problems specific to realities they have to deal with. It will include links and resources useful for participants in each country. Thus, we want to organize 5 transnational events - 1 short-term training event and 4 student exchanges. While the training takes place, teachers will assess the current situation of HR education in their own country and compare it with those of their partners. Also, we will help drafting the concept and contents of the course. Also we will choose the final topics, the methodology and task distribution.

While the 4 student exchanges take place, we will pilot the proposed activities, gather feedback and draw conclusions that may allow us to make final adjustments to the final contents. The student exchanges are an important part in the project, because of the international dimension they have and the benefits on pupils. Students will work together, interact, learn and develop tolerance and mutual respect, which is the base of HR. They will acquire knowledge regarding human rights and the defense of it against breaches or violations. Students will use creativity, by making artwork, improve their thinking, analytically and critically while analyzing case studies, communication skills and interpersonal skills while collaborating. They will develop equality of opportunities and universal values to which all persons must to align to.
